The twelve spies at Kadesh-barnea, the rebellion of the Israelites and the 40 years wandering in the Wilderness.



Key Verses

"God is not man, that he should lie, or a son of man, that he should change his mind. Has he said, and will he not do it? Or has he spoken, and will he not fulfill it?" (23:19 ESV)

"But as for you, your dead bodies shall fall in this wilderness. And your children shall be shepherds in the wilderness forty years and shall suffer for your faithlessness, until the last of your dead bodies lies in the wilderness." (14:32-33 ESV)
