Setting

Having been taken captive in 605 BC by Nebuchadnezzar, Daniel, a young man of noble blood, served in the government for about 60 years during the reigns of kings Nebuchadnezzar, Belshazzar, Darius, and Cyrus.

Special Features

Daniel's apocalyptic visions in chapters 8-12 give a glimpse of God's plan for the ages, including a direct prediction of the Messiah.



Key Verses

Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego replied to him, "King Nebuchadnezzar, we do not need to defend ourselves before you in this matter. If we are thrown into the blazing furnace, the God we serve is able to deliver us from it, and he will deliver us from Your Majesty's hand. But even if he does not, we want you to know, Your Majesty, that we will not serve your gods or worship the image of gold you have set up." (3:16-18 NIV)
