The Plains of Moab at the border of the Promised Land.

Special Features

The second giving of the Law, the passing of leadership from Moses to Joshua, Moses' final blessing upon the Children of Israel, and the death of Moses on Mount Nebo.



Key Verses

"Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might." (6:4-5 ESV)

"Today I have given you the choice between life and death, between blessings and curses. Now I call on heaven and earth to witness the choice you make. Oh, that you would choose life, so that you and your descendants might live!" (30:19 NLT)
