- > John Gill: Commentary on Job
 - John Gill (1697–1771) was an English Baptist pastor, biblical scholar, and theologian who held to a firm Calvinistic soteriology.
 - He became pastor at the Strict Baptist church at Goat Yard Chapel, Horsleydown, Southwark in 1719. His pastorate lasted 51 years.
 - This Baptist church was once pastored by Benjamin Keach and would later become the New Park Street Chapel and then the Metropolitan Tabernacle pastored by Charles Spurgeon. Classic work—will not disappoint!
- ➤ Albert Barnes: Barnes Notes on the Book of Job
 - Albert Barnes was an American theologian and a graduate from Princeton Theological Seminary in 1823.
 - Spurgeon's review of this work: "Exceedingly good!"
- ➤ Joseph S. Exell: <u>The Book of Job</u>
 - From *The Biblical Illustrator*. Provides a wealth of illustrations, outlines, poems, anecdotes, sermons, doctrine, similes, expositions, Bible backgrounds, and practical applications that can be shared with anyone. Wonderful!
- > Third Millennium Ministries: Study Notes on Job
 - Thirdmill was envisioned by Janie Pillow as she came to realize that Christian leaders around the world needed to be trained in their own lands.
 - With the help of Dr. Richard Pratt and a number of others who shared her vision, Thirdmill was launched in 1997 to create multimedia curriculum for Christian leaders everywhere.

 - Classic commentary by a renowned Old Testament scholar.

 - Seeking to provide a glimpse into the "intense reality of the message delivered," Dummelow's commentary helps readers who are used to studying the Bible with only an English translation take the next step in understanding the context of the Bible's diverse parts.
- ➤ H.L. Ellison: From Tragedy to Triumph: Studies in the Book of Job
 - However, after receiving Believer's Baptism, he was kicked out of the Church of England.
 - Upon his return to Britain, he held many positions in the academic realm as a respected Old Testament scholar.
- ➤ Charles Lee Feinberg: <u>The Book of Job</u>
 - Feinberg (1909 1995) was an American biblical scholar and professor of Semitics and Old Testament.
 - He was awarded his Th.D. (1935) from Dallas Theological Seminary and his Ph.D. (1945) in Archaeology and Semitic languages from Johns Hopkins University.
 - He was an authority on the Jewish history, languages and customs of the Old Testament and biblical prophecies.
- ➤ Charles Lee Feinberg: <u>Job and the Nation Israel 1: In the Hands of the Enemy</u>
- ➤ Charles Lee Feinberg: <u>Job and the Nation Israel 2</u>: At the Mercy of the Critics
- Charles Lee Feinberg: <u>Job and the Nation Israel 3: Face to Face with the Lord</u>
- Arno C. Gaebelein: <u>Annotated Bible Commentary on Job</u>
 - For more than half a century evangelist, author, journalist, and Bible expositor Gaebelein passionately proclaimed the prophetic truths of the Bible.
 - With a ministry that bridged two centuries and endured two world wars, Gaebelein never doubted the relevance of the study of prophecy for spiritual growth and for interaction with the chaos of culture.

 - Alexander Maclaren was a Scottish Baptist preacher, serving for many years at Union Chapel in Oxford Road, Manchester, where he remained until his retirement in 1903.
 - It was said that few speakers had exceeded Maclaren "for profundity of thought, logical arrangement, eloquence of appeal, and power over the human heart".
